The Integrated Geospatial Information Framework (IGIF), developed by the United Nations Committee of Experts on Global Geospatial Information Management (UN-GGIM), provides a structured approach to managing and utilizing geospatial data across various sectors, enabling better decision-making for sustainable development initiatives. IGIF provides a comprehensive blueprint for enhancing national and global geospatial information infrastructures. It offers a structured approach to improve geospatial data governance, interoperability, accessibility, and integration within the context of national development priorities, including the implementation of the UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

This one-day seminar aims to raise awareness of the IGIF, explore its benefits, and provide a platform for discussion on how governments, organizations, and stakeholders can leverage the framework to enhance their geospatial information systems for better decision-making and development outcomes.

About IGIF Implementation

There is broad global consensus, support, and agreement on the critical importance of the Integrated Geospatial Information Framework (IGIF) and its Implementation Guide to develop, integrate, and strengthen national geospatial information management arrangements in Member States. Many Member States are now developing IGIF Country-level Action Plans in order to address increasingly complex national, regional, and global challenges and to support the 2030 Agenda and its 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), and other global development agendas.

During this event, information will be provided on the progress and activities of the IGIF High level Group (HLG) and its work groups with an aim to create awareness of key work underway to support Member States at global level. Work group members will highlight progress and invite engagement from participants. Efforts have been made to provide an opportunity for the participants from Member States to share their experiences advancing the IGIF and developing Country-level Action Plans.

- **To Raise Awareness** about the importance of integrated geospatial information management for national development.
