WG2 Resolution (1/2) (new)



- 1) Recognising the importance of Expert Group on Land Administration and Management (EG- LAM)'s strategic work plan 2023-2035
- 2) Aligning effective land administration and the integration of the terrestrial, built, maritime and cadastral domains with the United Nations Integrated Geospatial Framework (UN-IGIF) to support climate change and building disaster resilience, planning, etc.;
- 3) Re-affirming of key principles in fit-for-purpose, interoperability, sustainability, flexibility and inclusiveness in effective and efficient land administration processes and systems;
- 4) Implementing the Framework for Effective Land Administration (FELA) at national level and in collaborations with regional committees, functional groups and international organizations;
- 5) Emphasizing the need to strengthen the human capacity and capability in areas related to land administration and management including data collection, systems, institutional or legal framework, and other pertinent sectors;
- 6) Recognizing leveraging synergies, avoid duplication through collaboration with other working groups of UN-GGIM-AP; and international organisations, such as FIG
- 7) Encouraging member states to send their delegates to share information and exchange knowledge
- 8) Acknowledging the memberships of Australia and China in WG 2

WG2 Resolution (2/2) (current)



- *6) Recommends* that UN-GGIM-AP:
 - a) *Continues* to advocate and raise political awareness of the benefits of effective and efficient land administration and management as stipulated in decision 7/108;
 - b) *Encourages* Member States engaging in the FELA, especially translating it in their own languages and practically implementing it, as leveraging the UN-IGIF Implementation Guide, working with UN-GGIM Expert Group on Land Administration and Management;
 - c) *Identifies and shares* diverse forms of forum for dialogue and coordination to strengthen human capacity building related to innovation in cadastre, land administration and management for sustainability and resilience;
 - d) *Requests* the Secretariat to continue to explore possible options (in a cost neutral manner) for building a UN-GGIM-AP geospatial information service centre with all interested Member States for practical provision of geospatial services and products to member countries of UN-GGIM-AP, considering cooperation with the United Nations GIS Service Centre of the United Nations Office on ICT (UN OICT) in Brindisi, Italy.
