IGIF

- Provides a **basis and guide** for developing, integrating, strengthening and maximizing geospatial information management and related resources in all countries.
- Will assist countries in **bridging the geospatial digital divide**, secure socio-economic prosperity, and to leave no one behind.

Resolution of the 8th Plenary meeting of UN-GGIM-AP

- **Recommends** that UN-GGIM-AP actively continues its efforts in supporting the implementation of the IGIF.
- **Acknowledges** the success of Fiji, Mongolia, Nepal and Tonga to serve as pilot countries in implementing the IGIF in the Asia-Pacific region through country-level action plans, and
- **Welcomes** **Indonesia, Kyrgyzstan (tbc) and Sri Lanka (tbc)** to serve as pilot countries in implementing the IGIF in 2020-2021 with their own country-level action plans.
- **Encourages** other Members States of the Regional Committee to become a pilot country of the IGIF, and to provide regional contributions to the implementation of the IGIF.

- Welcome more regional countries in the region to apply for pilot of IGIF
- Webinar(s) for pilot countries to introduce their experiences, lesson learnt and national level actions



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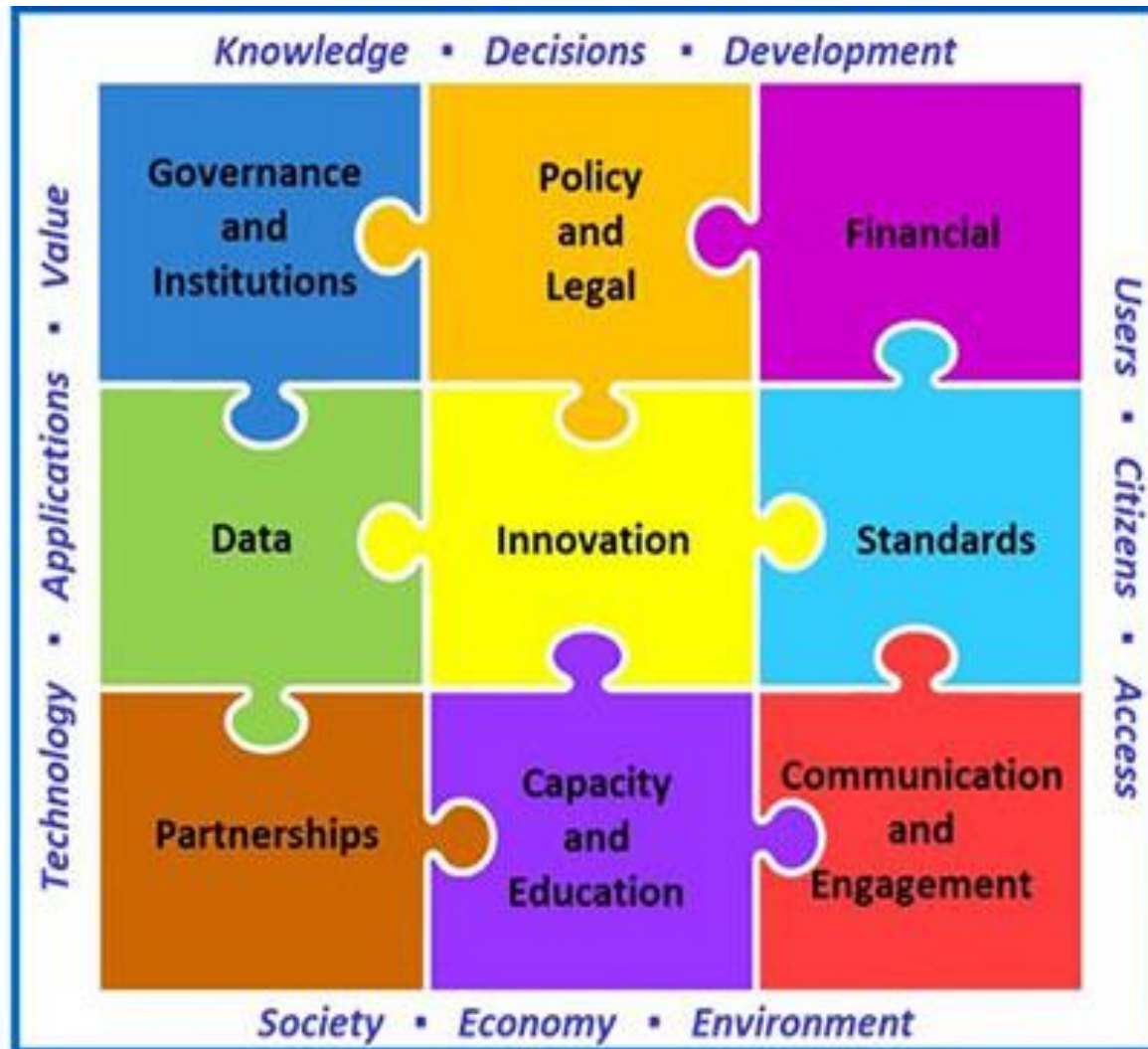


The Integrated Geospatial Information Framework provides a basis and guide for developing, integrating and strengthening geospatial information management.
